Post-Operative Instructions for Stainless-Steel Dental Crown

Congratulations on your child's new dental crown! Here are some essential guidelines to ensure a smooth recovery and maintain the integrity of the new crown:

Local Anesthetic Care

- Anesthetic Duration: The numbness from the local anesthetic will wear off in about 2-3 hours. During this
 period, keep a close eye on your child to prevent them from accidentally biting or sucking on their tongue, cheek,
 or lip.
- If an injury occurs: It's common for the area to develop a whitish-colored scab if bitten; this should heal within 5-7 days. Apply an ice pack for 15 minutes on and off. For pain management, administer Tylenol or Motrin, following age-appropriate doses.

Crown Care

- Initial Care: Avoid chewing on the crown for the first 12-24 hours to allow the cement to harden fully. After
 this period, normal chewing can resume.
- Oral Hygiene: Continue regular brushing and flossing, but avoid flossing around the new crown for the first 24 hours.

Eating Habits

 Dietary Precautions: Avoid hard, sticky, or chewy foods that could dislodge or damage the crown, like ice or hard candy.

Discomfort Management

- Gum Tissue: The gums around the treated tooth may be sore for a few days due to irritation during the procedure, as well as from the anesthetic injection site.
- Sensitivity: It's normal for the tooth to be slightly sensitive initially. This should subside within a few weeks. Over-the-counter pain medications like Tylenol or Advil can help.

Follow-Up Care and Natural Tooth Transition

- Routine Check-Ups: The integrity of the crown will be monitored at regular appointments. The baby tooth will naturally exfoliate with the crown when the permanent tooth erupts.
- In Case of Dislodgement: If the crown comes off prematurely, store it in a zip-lock bag and contact our
 office immediately.
